Other courses to be taken:

- BASc(AppliedAI) students are required to complete 18 credits of BASc Core Courses as part of their graduation requirement. One of the required BASc Core Course to be taken in 2<sup>nd</sup> semester is BASC9001 Foundation of Human Knowledge (course code and title to be confirmed), pending the Senate's approval. (Venue: T6, Meng Wah Complex)
- Candidates who have achieved Level 5 or above in English Language in the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education Examination (HKDSE), or equivalent, are exempted from taking CAES1000 Core University English. Candidates who are not exempted from Core University English will be required to take CAES1000 as supplementary credits and will thereby be required to accumulate 246 credits for graduation from the University.

Remarks:

- As there are over dozens of subclasses in CAES1000, seats are not reserved for freshmen, who are free to choose the most suitable timeslots according to their preference.
- MATH2014: A no. of places are reserved in subclass B for BASc(AppliedAI) students. See the timeslots above.

Notes:

- As there may be different subclasses in each course, the above time slots are suggestions only. Students can choose other subclasses of the above-mentioned courses should they prefer, as long as there are no time clashes. Please note that seats are not subclasses other than the ones listed above.
- The above timetables are put together for students' reference only. In the event of discrepancies between the above timeslots and the online information in Portal, the online information in Portal shall prevail.
- Students should always select core or required courses first, i.e. the above-mentioned courses when adding courses into their course selection reports.
- Students should check their class selection results periodically. If students are not successful in getting a place in their first choice, they should choose another time slot, given that each subclass has a quota.
- Students are strongly advised to complete their course selection exercise before the suspension period. This is because the number of available places in certain courses may drop significantly after the suspension period, where course-based clearing (or so-called class balloting) will be performed.
- Students are also reminded to pay attention to the quota and drop-consent, if applicable, of each course. Any enquiries about the courses should be directed to the corresponding *course-offering* departments/schools if necessary.
- The third BASc Core Course should be APAI9001 Basic Programming and Computer Software Skills (course code and title to be confirmed). It should be offered in year 2020-21 pending the Senate's approval. More detail will be announced in due course.
